Recovery-aware refers solely to operational pacing, handling, and coordination considerations and does not involve clinical assessment, medical monitoring, or clinical decision-making.

3. Key Pricing Determinants

Final pricing is influenced by one or more of the following factors:

- Patient mobility limitations and recovery sensitivity
- Vehicle configuration (WAV, securement, leg extension, bariatric needs)
- Staffing configuration (driver only, attendant support, extended assistance)
- Timing (standard hours vs after-hours / protected windows)
- Journey structure (single transfer, round trip, multi-stop itinerary)
- Access constraints (stairs, non-accessible environments, long distances)
- Coordination requirements with hospitals, clinics, or residential settings

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All services are planned following intake to ensure appropriate resource allocation and safe execution.
